By this common order, I shall be disposing of these five writ petitions bearing CWP Nos.5699, 3171, 14410, 14341 and 14342 of 2013 as common issue are involved.

2. In the instant petition, petitioners have challenged internal communication between the Government and Registrar General of this Court dated 6.8.2012 (Annexure P2) and subsequent clarification dated 09.01.2013 (Annexure P3) vide which letter dated 15.12.2011 has been withdrawn and further sought for re-fixation of their pay.

3. Orders dated 6.8.2012 and 09.01.2013 are internal communication between State of Punjab and Registrar General of this Court for taking necessary action with reference to State Government decision releasing to revision of pay scale. Further, Registrar General of this Court has not acted upon while re-fixing the petitioners' pay and ordered for recovery, if any. In other words, the present petition is premature insofar as

the re-fixation or recovery are concerned.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that in the absence of order of re-fixation of pay, competent Authority has reduced petitioners' pay w.e.f. 1.12.2011. If it is so, petitioners have to challenge the pay slip.

5. In view of these factual aspects, the present petitions do not survive for consideration. Accordingly, petitions stand disposed of. Reserving liberty to the petitioners to challenge the pay slip by which their pay is stated to have been reduced. In the absence of specific order and so also challenge to that order or action in the present petitions such issues cannot be gone into.
