By virtue of instant petition preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought a writ in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to grant family pension, along-with interest @18% per annum, to her on account of death of her husband-Randhir Singh

2. The contention of learned counsel for the petitioner is that the husband of the petitioner expired during service on April 20, 2008 but till date family pension has not been granted to her. Petitioner constrained to file a representation dated October 05, 2017 (P-7), which also did not fetch any reply. He further submits that he feels satisfied in case a direction is issued to respondents to dispose of the representation (P-7) within a time bound manner.

3. Accordingly, instant petition is disposed with a direction to respondents particularly respondent No.2 to look into the grievances unfolded

by the petitioner in her representation (P-7) and to take a conscious decision in accordance with law, rules and regulations within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order. In case any adverse order is to be passed, to pass a speaking order. In that event, petitioner shall be at liberty to have recourse to the other remedies available to her under law.
