Learned counsel for the petitioners states that bifurcation of the Panchayat has been done on the basis of resolution which bore forged and fake signatures. Further states that representations have been made opposing the bifurcation as the same would be against the interest of the existing Gram Panchayat.

After hearing the learned counsel for the petitioners, we are of the opinion that no prejudice manifests itself from the facts. Neither any violation nor any distortion in the creation of the Gram Panchayat has been shown. No site plan has been placed on record to enable us to understand the grievance. Besides, the argument that signatures were forged is something that we cannot determine in the present proceedings under Article 226 of the Constitution of India.

No ground to interfere.
