Through the instant civil writ petition, preferred under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, petitioner has sought the issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondent No.3 to provide all the relief such as family pension, ex-gratia, subsistence allowance due to killing of Major Singh -husband of the petitioner who was serving as SPO in Punjab Police on 28.07.2003 by unkown terrorist outfit persons due to which he died on 28.07.2003 for which petitioner is entitled for above said benefits as per the terms and conditions of policy/Punjab Govt. Notifications No.8/259/90-RR-II/10778 dated 10.05.1990 (P-8), No. 8/259/90-RR-II/936, dated 30.09.1992 (P-9), No. 12/34/98-RR-2/14896, dated 07.12.1998 (P-10), letter dated 03.07.2001 (P-11) and Instructions dated 06.03.2006 (P-12).

2. The contention of learned counsel for the petitioner is that the matter has already been referred to the Sub-Divisional Magistrar, Tehsil

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Patti, District Tarn Taran to Sub-Divisional Magistrate, Amritsar as the case of the petitioner falls within the jurisdiction of the said authority vide letter No.R.R.C./169 dated 15.02.2018 (P-15). A copy of which was also sent to the O/o Deputy Commissioner, Amritsar as well as petitioner. Since the O/o Deputy Commissioner, Amritsar and Sub-Divisional Magistrate/SDO (Civil), Amritsar are already seisin of the matter.

3. Instant petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.3 to look into the grievances unfolded by the petitioner in her representation dated 02.06.2017 (P-7) and to take a conscious decision by passing a speaking order as per rules and instructions issued by the Government of Punjab from time to time, within a period of four months from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

4. However, if petitioner still feels aggrieved by any of the orders passed by the aforesaid authority, she shall be at liberty to approach this Court.
