Learned counsel for respondent no.3- Central Council of Homoeopathy has placed on record a detailed consideration report dated 27.6.2018 where the case of the petitioner-College has been recommended for allowing admission to current session 2018-19. For the purposes of reference, we extract the relevant portion as below:-

	Chandigarh – 160019 CHANDIG ARH						earlier subject to the removal of deficiencies reflected in the report of inspection before 31.12.2018. The committee are of the opinion that as the session 2017-18 is already over, the issue of admission for 2017-18 has become infructuous.
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The Executive Committee after going through the Order dated 29.05.2018 of the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab & Haryana at Chandigarh considered the report of inspection carried out by the Central Council on 7.6.2018 along with the representation dated 01.06.2018 by the Principal of Homoeopathic Medical College, Chandigarh and after threadbare discussion it made above recommendations.”

This would redress the grievance of the petitioner largely.

However, a formal decision is to be taken by the Union of India.

Consequently, in view of the above inspection report which has been accepted by the Central Council of Homoeopathy, we dispose of the instant petition with a direction to UOI to positively take a decision on the aforesaid issue within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of the certified copy of this order.
