This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for the issuance of a writ, in the nature of mandamus directing the respondent to count qualifying service of the petitioners for grant of revised pensionary benefits.

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that case of the petitioners is covered by a judgment passed by this Court in CWP-7386-2016, titled as “**Harmeet Kaur Vs. Pepsu Road Transport Corporation, Nabha Road, Patiala**” decided on 23.04.2018 (Annexure P-7). Further, he states that at this stage he would be satisfied, if a direction is issued to respondent-Managing Director, Pepsu Road Transport Corporation, Nabha Road, Patiala to consider and decide the legal notice dated 28.05.2018 (Annexure P-6) in the light of Annexure P-7.

Heard.

In view of the above, without adverting to the merits of the

case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent-Managing Director, Pepsu Road Transport Corporation, Nabha Road, Patiala to consider and decide the legal notice dated 28.05.2018 (Annexure P-6) in the light of Annexure P-7 within six weeks from the receipt of the certified copy of the order. In case, on consideration, the competent authority reaches to the conclusion that the benefit claimed by the petitioners is admissible to them, in such eventuality, the consequential relief be allowed to them, within a period of six weeks thereafter. However, in case the competent authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioners is not admissible or made out, in that case, a speaking order be passed in the matter.
