Resultantly, no separate orders were passed in the cross-objections when the main appeal was disposed of on 02.11.2018.

XOBJR-60-CI-2009

The notification in question under Section 4 of the Land Acquisition Act, 1894 is dated 07.08.1995 and the impugned order of the Reference Court is dated 15.02.2005, whereby a bunch of 35 cases were disposed of. In the appeal also the benefit to the landowners has already been granted by enhancing the market value for the notification dated 07.08.1995 and by modifying the Award dated 15.02.2005.

Resultantly, the present cross-objection stands allowed and the landowners would be entitled for the benefit of the enhanced compensation, in view of the observations which have already been made in the main appeal on 02.11.2018.
