Prayer in the instant petition filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, *inter alia*, is for issuance of a writ in the nature of Mandamus, directing the respondents to release the retiral benefits of the petitioner.

At the very outset, learned state counsel has filed affidavit dated 08.10.2018, on behalf of respondent Nos.1 to 3 in the Court, which is taken on record. As per the affidavit, all the retiral benefits have been released to the petitioner as indicated in the table reflected in para No.2 thereof.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner states that the interest on the delayed payment has not been paid.

Keeping in view the fact that all the retiral benefits have been released in favour of the petitioner, no further order is required to be passed

in the matter. However, the petitioner is free to represent before the competent authority for redressal of his grievance, if any, subsists.
