This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for the issuance of a writ, in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to release the balance payment of ₹18,15,879/- qua the works of lining of W/C of O/L of Bhaini Disty, executed by the petitioner alongwith interest @ 12 % p.a.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that at this stage he would be satisfied, if a direction is issued to respondent No.3-Divisional Engineer, Lining Division No.1, Punjab Water Resources Management & Development Corporation Ltd, Canal Colony, Ferozepur to consider and decide the representation dated 14.10.2017 (Annexure P-2).

Heard.

In view of the above, without advertng to the merits of the

case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.3- Divisional Engineer, Lining Division No.1, Punjab Water Resources Management & Development Corporation Ltd, Canal Colony, Ferozepur to consider and decide the representation dated 14.10.2017 (Annexure P-2) within six weeks from the receipt of the certified copy of the order. In case, on consideration, the competent authority reaches to the conclusion that the benefit claimed by the petitioner is admissible to it, in such eventuality, the consequential relief be allowed to the petitioner, within a period of six weeks thereafter. However, in case the competent authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioner is not admissible or made out, in that case, a speaking order be passed in the matter.
