JITENDRA CHAUHAN, J.

This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for the issuance of a writ, in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to make the payment of works executed by the petitioner along with interest @ 12% per annum.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that at this stage he would be satisfied, if a direction is issued to respondent No.2-Executive Engineer (Civil), Punjab Mandi Board, Sri Muktsar Sahib to consider and decide the legal notice dated 27.11.2017 (Annexure P-3).

Learned State counsel states that she has no objection in case the prayer of the petitioner is accepted.

Heard.

In view of the above, without adverting to the merits of the

case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2-Executive Engineer (Civil), Punjab Mandi Board, Sri Muktsar Sahib to consider and decide the legal notice dated 27.11.2017 (Annexure P-3) within six weeks from the receipt of the certified copy of the order. In case, on consideration, the competent authority reaches to the conclusion that the benefit claimed by the petitioner is admissible to him, in such eventuality, the consequential relief be allowed to him, within a period of six weeks thereafter. However, in case the competent authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioner is not admissible to him or made out, in that case, a speaking order be passed in the matter.
