After hearing the learned counsel for the petitioners, we do not want to interfere at this stage as the petition is wholly premature.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioners contends that proceedings are pending before the Appellate Tribunal, Prevention of Money Laundering Act, New Delhi and it be directed to conclude the proceedings as expeditiously as possible, particularly when there is a statutory mandate to do so.

Upon perusal of zimni orders produced before us, we are of the opinion that no untoward delay has been caused by the Tribunal in deciding the appeal. Therefore, there is no necessity of issuing a positive mandate to conclude the proceedings as it is always expected that a statutory body would decide the proceedings as expeditiously as possible. We expect that the needful shall be done on the next date

of hearing.
