The order impugned in this writ petition has been passed by the Debts Recovery Tribunal-III, Chandigarh dismissing the petitioner's S.A. being barred by limitation. The petitioner sought condonation of delay by moving an application under Section 5 of the Limitation Act but the same has been declined.

The above stated order, in our considered view, is appealable before the Debts Recovery Appellate Tribunal. Consequently, the writ petition is disposed of relegating the petitioner to avail the above-stated remedy. It is directed that in case the petitioner approaches the Appellate Tribunal within two weeks, the time taken by him in filing the instant writ petition after the order passed by the Debts Recovery Tribunal-III, Chandigarh, will be over-looked by the Appellate Tribunal.
