Petitioner was candidate for the post of constable/ Driver-2016 and the eligibility clause was that candidate must have more than 167 CMs height. Petitioner appeared for measurement of his height but failed because

Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India is for quashing of the order dated 11.01.2017 (Annexure P-5) passed by respondent No.3-Assistant Commandant/ Member-I/ Recruiting Board, CISF, Jaipur.

The contention of learned counsel representing the petitioner is that the height of the petitioner is more than 167 CMs. In this regard, the petitioner got his height measured at Lok Nayak Hospital, New Delhi.

On asking of the petitioner, he was again ordered to be examined by the Medical Board, vide order of this Court dated 31.07.2017. Copy of the report of the Medical Board, constituted by Government Multi Speciality Hospital, Sector-16, Chandigarh (Annexure R-1) is available on the file and as per the opinion of the Board, the height of the petitioner is 166.6 CMs whereas the minimum height required for the post applied by the petitioner is 167 CMs. As such, the present petition is without any merit and the same stands dismissed.
