This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for the issuance of a writ, in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to promote the petitioners as Head Constables and the petitioners be granted all benefits w.e.f. 04.04.2016 i.e. from the date they were initially promoted (Annexure P-1)

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that at this stage he would be satisfied, if a direction is issued to respondent No.3- Additional Director General of Police, Information Technology and Communication, Punjab, Chandigarh to consider and decide the representation dated 06.11.2017 (Annexure P-6).

Heard.

In view of the above, without adverting to the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.3- Additional Director General of Police, Information Technology and

Communication, Punjab, Chandigarh to consider and decide the representation dated 06.11.2017 (Annexure P-6) within six weeks from the receipt of the certified copy of the order. In case, on consideration, the competent authority reaches to the conclusion that the benefit claimed by the petitioners is admissible to them, in such eventuality, the consequential relief be allowed to them, within a period of six weeks thereafter. However, in case the competent authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioners is not admissible or made out, in that case, a speaking order be passed in the matter.
