This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for the issuance of a writ, in the nature of mandamus directing respondent No.2 to expeditiously decide the representation dated 09.02.2018 (Annexure P-4) filed by the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that at this stage he would be satisfied, if a direction is issued to respondent No.2- Chairman/Managing Director, Punjab State Warehouse Corporation, SCO No.74-75, Bank Square, Sector-17-B, Chandigarh to consider and decide the representation dated 09.02.2018 (Annexure P-4) preferably prior to the date of superannuation (i.e. 31.03.2018) of the petitioner.

Heard.

In view of the above, without adverting to the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2-

Chairman/Managing Director, Punjab State Warehouse Corporation, SCO No.74-75, Bank Square, Sector-17-B, Chandigarh to consider and decide the representation dated 09.02.2018 (Annexure P-4) preferably prior to the date of superannuation of the petitioner. In case, on consideration, the competent authority reaches to the conclusion that the benefit claimed by the petitioner is admissible to him, in such eventuality, the consequential relief be allowed to him. However, in case the competent authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioner is not admissible or made out, in that case, a speaking order be passed in the matter.

A copy of this order be given to learned counsel for the petitioner under the signatures of the Bench Secretary of this Court.
