This appeal has arisen from the judgment and decree dated 27.10.2014 by which a petition filed by the respondent under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 [for short 'the Act'] for dissolution of his marriage with the appellant by way of decree of divorce was allowed.

The parties have entered into a compromise during the pendency of this appeal and in pursuance thereof, the respondent has transferred his house in the name of appellant/wife. The only dispute which is now left to be decided is about the payment of ₹5,000/- as maintenance through out the life of the appellant.

We have heard both the appellant and respondents and their counsels.

It is suggested by the learned counsel for the parties that this Court may direct the employer of the respondent to transfer ₹5,000/- out of

his salary to the account of the appellant till he is in service and thereafter he would deposit ₹5000/- in her account on his own.

In view thereof, the present appeal is hereby disposed of as having not been pressed any further by the appellant/wife, upholding the decree of divorce granted to the respondent by the trial Court, with a rider that the employer, who happens to be the police authorities, as the respondent is a constable in Punjab Police, shall deduct ₹5,000/- from his salary and transfer the same to the bank account of the appellant/wife which is mentioned in the petition as 50028867684.

Registry is directed to send a copy of this order to the Director General of Police, Punjab and SSP, Gurdaspur for their information and necessary action.

It is made clear that in case any amount of arrear towards the payment of maintenance of ₹5000/- is left unpaid the appellant may file an appropriate application in this case.
