This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for the issuance of a writ, in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to continue the petitioner in service as part time Lecturers (Guest Faculty) till the time of regular selection and appointment thereafter by the competent authority.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that case of the petitioner is covered by Annexures P-1 to P-5. Further, he states that at this stage he would be satisfied if the instant writ petition is treated as representation and direction is issued to respondent No.1-Principal Secretary to Government, Department of Higher Education, Civil Secretariat Punjab, Chandigarh to consider and decide the claim of the petitioner in the light of Annexures P-1 to P-5.

Heard.

In the circumstances, the petitioner is directed to furnish a copy

of the writ petition along with certified copy of the order passed within two weeks from today. Thereafter, respondent No.1-Principal Secretary to Government, Department of Higher Education, Civil Secretariat Punjab, Chandigarh is directed to treat the copy of present writ petition as representation and decide the same by passing a speaking order within a period of six weeks from the receipt of certified copy of the order. In case, the competitive authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioner is not made out, then a speaking order be passed in this regard.
