Aggrieved by the dismissal of his petition for divorce, the appellant-husband has preferred this appeal.

During pendency of the appeal, the parties appear to have amicably settled the dispute by entering into an agreement before the Mediation Centre, Sangrur. Parties have finally agreed to part company by filing a petition for divorce by mutual consent under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.

It has been informed that petition under Section 13-B of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 has been filed on 25.07.2018. Respondent-Amandeep Kaur, present in Court, informs that the statements of the parties have been recorded at first motion hearing and the next date of hearing before the Matrimonial Court is 27.01.2019. Photocopy of the

agreement has been brought to the notice of the Court. A copy of the agreement has been taken on record.

In view of the said circumstances, the appeal is disposed of as having rendered infructuous on the basis of settlement having been arrived at between the parties, without prejudice to the rights of the appellant to seek revival in case of any violation of the terms of the agreement dated 13.06.2018, if it is not finalized by the month of March, 2019.
