This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for the issuance of a writ, in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to count the service rendered by the petitioner on the post of SPO as qualifying service for the purpose of grant of seniority.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that case of the petitioner is covered by a judgment passed by this Court in CR-2295-2010 titled as “**Constable Rajinder Kumar Vs. State of Punjab and others**” decided on 06.09.2010 (Annexure P-2). Further, learned counsel states that at this stage he would be satisfied, if a direction is issued to respondent No.2-Director General of Police, Punjab, Punjab Police Head Quarter, Sector-9, Chandigarh to consider and decide claim of the petitioner in the light of Annexure P-2 passed in case of Constable Rajinder Kumar.

Heard.

In view of the above, without adverting to the merits of the

case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.2- Director General of Police, Punjab, Punjab Police Head Quarter, Sector-9, Chandigarh to consider and decide claim of the petitioner in the light of Annexure P-2 passed in case of Constable Rajinder Kumar within six weeks from the receipt of the certified copy of the order. In case, on consideration, the competent authority reaches to the conclusion that the benefit claimed by the petitioner is admissible to him, in such eventuality, the consequential relief be allowed to him, within a period of six weeks thereafter. However, in case the competent authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioner is not admissible to him or made out, in that case, a speaking order be passed in the matter.
