This writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India has been filed for the issuance of a writ, in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to grant all consequential benefits to the petitioners with interest from the date of removal/termination till date of reinstatement.

Learned counsel for the petitioners states that at this stage he would be satisfied, if a direction is issued to respondent No.1-Secretary to Government of Punjab, Department of Rural Development and Panchayat, Punjab, Punjab Mini Secretariat, Sector-9, Chandigarh to consider and decide the legal notice dated 04.12.2017 (Annexure P-20).

Heard.

In view of the above, without adverting to the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondent No.1-Secretary to Government of Punjab, Department of Rural Development and Panchayat, Punjab, Punjab Mini Secretariat, Sector-9, Chandigarh to

consider and decide the legal notice dated 04.12.2017 (Annexure P-20) within six weeks from the receipt of the certified copy of the order. In case, on consideration, the competent authority reaches to the conclusion that the benefit claimed by the petitioners is admissible to them, in such eventuality, the consequential relief be allowed to them, within a period of six weeks thereafter. However, in case the competent authority feels that the relief claimed by the petitioners is not admissible to them or made out, in that case, a speaking order be passed in the matter.
