The order passed by the learned Single Judge has been challenged by filing the present intra-court appeal. Along with the appeal, applications seeking condonation of delay of 205 days in filing and 90 days in re-filing thereof have also been filed.

In the case in hand, father of the appellant had expired on 18.02.1996, while in service. This case is regarding compassionate appointment or ex-gratia payment, which was kept pending, as the respondent was minor at the time of death of his father. His case was initially declined in the year 2013. Keeping in view terms of the Haryana Compassionate Assistance to the Dependents of Deceased Government Employees Rules, 2006 (for short, 'Rules, 2006'), learned Single Judge has directed for grant of ex-gratia benefits admissible under the Rules 2006.

There is no error in the order passed by the learned Single Judge. Even otherwise, no ground is made out in the application seeking condonation of delay. The contents thereof shows casualness at every stage.

Accordingly, the appeal is dismissed. Consequently, the applications seeking condonation of delay in filing and refiling the appeal are also dismissed.
