The order passed by the learned Single Judge dismissing the writ petition has been impugned in the present intra-court appeal.

Challenge in the writ petition was to the order dated 18.11.2013, vide which claim of the appellant for reinstatement in service was declined. The appellant in the case in hand was appointed as ETT Teacher. However, his services were terminated vide order dated 22.10.2009, as the experience certificate submitted by him was found to be bogus. In the earlier round of litigation, the matter was remitted back to be considered by a Committee headed by District Education Officer to bring out the genuineness of the certificate. It has been recorded in the order passed by the learned Single Judge that in the record produced by the

Principal during enquiry, it was found that the appellant, in fact, had

worked as Punjabi teacher, whereas he had been shown to be taking classes of Social Studies in the time table produced. No other document except attendance register or pay distribution register was produced. In the pay distribution register, though provident fund was deducted but there was no proof produced for deposit of the same with Employees' Provident Fund organisation. No bank statement was produced regarding payment of salary to the appellant besides other discrepancies in the record.

From the aforesaid facts, the learned Single Judge found that there was no error in dismissal of the appellant from service on account of production of false/fake/bogus experience certificate. There is no error in the order passed by the learned Single Judge dismissing the writ petition.

Accordingly, the appeal is dismissed.
