The present appeal is barred by as much as 1036 days, which is directed against the award of the Reference Court, Bhiwani dated 14.07.2014.

Counsel for the appellants has placed reliance upon judgment passed in RFA-2544-2015 titled *Anoop Singh & others Vs. State of Haryana & another*, decided on 29.09.2015.

On the other hand, State Counsel submits that the case would be covered rather by the judgment passed in RFA-2463-2015 titled *Shri Kishan & others Vs. State of Haryana & another*, decided on the same date.

A perusal of the said judgment would go on to show that the acquisition is of the same date i.e., 28.02.2010 and the land is situated in Village Baund Kalan, which was acquired for the purpose of construction of Baund Drain and Malkosh-Nimri Link Drain. A perusal of the Reference Court award in the present case would show that the compensation of Rs.8,00,000/-, as awarded by the Land

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Acquisition Collector on 20.08.2008, had been further enhanced to Rs.50,000/- per acre. The said award would also go on to show that the reference petition in **Shri Kishan** (supra) finds mention in the same.

Accordingly, the application for condonation of delay of 1036 days in filing the appeal, is hereby allowed and the delay of 1036 days in filing the appeal is condoned, by denying the interest element, keeping in view the judgments of the Apex Court in **Imrat Lal & others Vs. Land Acquisition Collector & others 2015 (2) RCR (Civil) 437** and **Dhiraj Singh (D) Th. LRs. Vs. Haryana State & others 2015 (2) RCR (Civil) 507.**

Accordingly, for the reasons mentioned above, the present appeal is allowed. The landowners are awarded compensation @ Rs.9,53,000/- per acre. They shall also be entitled to all the statutory benefits available to them under the Land Acquisition Act, 1894, in terms of **Shri Kishan** (supra). The appellants shall, however, not be entitled for the interest element for 1036 days.
