This is an application under Section 24 of the Hindu Marriage Act filed by the appellant-husband seeking maintenance pendente lite from his wife by pleading that he does not have sufficient means of livelihood and is earning around Rs.6000/- to Rs.7000/- per month whereas the respondent-wife is employed in Haryana Police and earning a sum of Rs.40,000/- per month.

We have considered the facts and circumstances of the application.

The appellant-husband, in the present case, is seeking divorce from the respondent-wife. He has claimed that his earning is only Rs.6000/- to Rs.7000/- per month. The said amount appears to be sufficient enough to enable him to survive as the respondent-wife does not claim any maintenance from him. The child born out of the wedlock is also maintained by the respondent-wife.

The circumstances do not warrant grant of any maintenance pendente lite to the appellant-husband.

Application under Section 24 of the Hindu Marriage Act filed by the appellant-husband, is dismissed.
