Respondent has not appeared despite service.

This is a petition filed under Section 24 of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 seeking transfer of the case filed under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, titled as '**Kuldeep Singh versus Jaspreet Kaur**', pending in the Court of District Judge, Family Court Moga to the Courts at Ludhiana.

It comes out that petitioner-wife filed two cases one under Section 125 of the Code of Criminal Procedure and the other under Sections 12 read with Section 17, 18, 19, 20, 22 and 31 of the Protection of Women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005 which are pending in the Court before the learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Jagraon. Petitioner belongs to village Pakhowal, Tehsil Raikot, District Ludhiana.

I am of the view that if the petitioner can go from her village to Jagraon, she can also go to Moga, which is on the National Highway and frequent bus service is also available.

In view of the above, no ground is made out to transfer the case titled as 'Kuldeep Singh versus Jaspreet Kaur', pending in the Court of District Judge, Family Court Moga to the Courts at Ludhiana.

Dismissed.

Since, the main petition stands dismissed, the miscellaneous application, if any, also stands disposed of.
