KULDIP SINGH J. (ORAL)

Petitioner seeks transfer of a petition filed under Section 9 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, titled as “*Jagjiwan Singh vs Paramjit Kaur*”, pending in the Court of learned Addl. Civil Judge (Sr. Divn.), Malerkotla, to a Court of competent jurisdiction at Moga.

It is stated that there is a distance of about 100 Kms. between two places and the petition, which is sought to be transferred has been filed only to harass the petitioner. It is also stated that a petition under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, is pending between the parties at Moga Courts.

Keeping in view the difficulty expressed by the petitioner, the petition filed under Section 9 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, titled as “*Jagjiwan Singh vs Paramjit Kaur*”, pending in the Court of learned Addl. Civil Judge (Sr. Divn.), Malerkotla, is withdrawn from the said Court and

transferred to the Court of learned District Judge, Moga, who shall transfer the same to the Court, where the petition under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, between the parties is pending.

As such, the present petition is allowed. Since, the main petition has been allowed, therefore, the pending application, if any, also stands disposed of.
