KULDIP SINGH J. (ORAL)

Respondent has not come present despite service. Hence, proceeded against ex-parte.

This is a petition filed under Section 24 read with Section 151 of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908, seeking transfer of the petition filed under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 titled as **“Jagdeep versus Smt. Geeta Devi”** pending in the Court of learned District Judge, Hisar to the Court of competent jurisdiction at Jind.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that petitioner has filed an application under Section 125 of the Code of Criminal Procedure at Jind Courts. He further submits that petitioner is having two minor children who are living with her and it is difficult for her to go from Jind to Hisar Courts to pursue her litigation.

Considering the difficulty expressed by the petitioner; the fact that none has appeared to oppose the petition and in order to ensure that all the cases should be tried at one place, petition filed under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 titled as **“Jagdeep versus Smt. Geeta Devi”** pending in the Court of learned District Judge, Hisar is withdrawn from the said Court and transferred to the Court of learned District Judge, Jind, who may retain the case himself or entrust it to any other Court of competent jurisdiction for trial.

In view of above, petition stands allowed.
