KULDIP SINGH J. (ORAL)

Petitioner seeks transfer of a suit for possession by way of specific performance bearing No.1215 of 2015, titled as ***“Beant Kaur and another versus Darshan Singh”*** pending in the Court of learned Civil Judge (Jr. Divn.), Nabha, District Patiala to a Court of competent jurisdiction at Sangrur or any other nearby District.

It comes out that a civil suit is pending since 2015. The suit is for specific performance. The transfer of the suit/plaint has been sought on the ground that one Sandeep Singh Ganda, Advocate, who is relative of Darshan Singh and practicing at Nabha Courts, is influencing the witnesses.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that on his application for transfer, the learned District Judge, Patiala has transferred the case from the Court of learned Additional Civil Judge (Sr. Divn.), Nabha to the Court of learned Civil Judge (Junior Division), Nabha. The

said order of transfer has not been challenged. The petitioner is not satisfied with the local transfer of the case and wants the case to be transferred outside Nabha. If it is so, the petitioner should have prayed to the learned District Judge for transfer the case from Nabha to District Head quarter or any other Sub Division.

However, so far as this case is concerned, no ground is made out to transfer the suit bearing No.1215 of 2015, titled as ***“Beant Kaur and another versus Darshan Singh”***.

As such, the present petition is dismissed. Since the main petition has been dismissed, therefore, the pending application, if any, also stands disposed of.
