KULDIP SINGH J. (ORAL)

This is a petition filed under Section 24 of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 for transfer of case titled as 'Pardeep versus Silpi' under Section 9 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, pending in the Court of learned Additional Civil Judge (Senior Division), Jind to a Court of competent jurisdiction at Panipat.

Heard.

It comes out that two cases i.e., one filed by the father of the petitioner under Sections 323, 34, 354, 406, 498-A and 506 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Panipat City, Panipat and the other filed by the petitioner under Section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881 are pending at Panipat Courts.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is unable to pursue the above mentioned case which has been filed by respondent at Jind under Section 9 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955.

Considering the difficulty expressed by the present petitioner and in order to ensure that all the cases should be tried at one place, case titled as 'Pardeep versus Silpi' under Section 9 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955, pending in the Court of learned Additional Civil Judge (Senior Division), Jind is withdrawn from the said Court and transferred to the Court of learned Civil Judge (Senior Division), Panipat who may retain the case himself or entrust it to any other Court of competent jurisdiction for trial.

In view of above, petition stands allowed.

Since, the main petition has been allowed, the miscellaneous application pending, if any, also stands disposed of.
