1. *Whether the Reporters of local newspaper may be allowed to see the judgment ?*

KULDIP SINGH J. (ORAL)

This is a petition filed under Section 24 of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908, seeking transfer of the petition filed under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 titled as **“Amit Kumar @ Sonu versus Pooja @ Meenakshi”** pending in the Court of learned District Judge, Amritsar to a Court of competent jurisdiction at Ludhiana.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that petitioner has filed a petition under Section 125 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of maintenance before the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Ludhiana. However, learned counsel for the respondent has submitted the same has now been dismissed in default.

Learned counsel for the petitioner further submits that it is difficult for the petitioner to go from Ludhiana to Amritsar to pursue her case.

Considering the difficulty expressed by the petitioner, petition filed under Section 13 of the Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 titled as **“Amit Kumar @ Sonu versus Pooja @ Meenakshi”** pending in the Court of learned District Judge, Amritsar is withdrawn from the said Court and transferred to the Court of learned District Judge, Ludhiana, who may retain the case himself or entrust it to any other Court of competent jurisdiction for trial.

In view of above, petition stands allowed.

Since, the main petition is allowed, the miscellaneous application pending, if any, also stands disposed of.
