Petitioner seeks transfer of petition bearing DMC No.55 dated 20.1.2017 filed under Section 13 of Hindu Marriage Act, 1955 by the respondent titled as *Ajay vs. Nisha* pending in the Court of learned District Judge (Family Court), Sonapat to a Court of competent jurisdiction at District Panipat.

Heard.

It comes out that earlier also, husband was tried on the complaint of the wife in an FIR case. He was acquitted in the said case. Now, the appeal is stated to be pending before this Court.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that two other cases between the parties are pending at Panipat Courts. However, this Court is of the view that there is not much distance between Sonapat and Panipat.

Both the stations are on national highway and are well connected with rail

and bus services, apart from other modes of transportation. Witnesses also belong to Sonapat.

In these circumstances, there is no ground to transfer the case from Sonapat Courts to Panipat Courts.

Resultantly, the present transfer petition stands dismissed.

Keeping in view the fact that it is a matrimonial dispute, learned District Judge (Family Court), Sonapat is directed to refer the case to Mediation and Conciliation Centre at Sonapat so that efforts could be made for reconciliation.
