INDERJIT SINGH, J.

Petitioner has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.158 dated 05.04.2018, registered at Police Station Badshahpur, Gurugram, Haryana, under Sections 406, 419, 420, 467, 468, 471, 506 and 120-B of IPC (Section 419 of IPC added later on.)

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that the present petitioner is not named in the FIR. No role has been attributed to him.

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Learned State counsel submits that the petitioner showing himself as Director has issued authority letter in favour of Gajender Singh Raghav for selling the property of R.K.Enterprises.

Co-accused, Gajender Singh Raghav has already been granted the benefit of regular bail by this Court vide order dated 07.12.2018 passed in CRM-M-47780-2018. Challan has already been presented. Moreover, the petitioner has been in custody since 03.07.2018. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. He is only to face the trial which may take a long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
