

IOIN-CRM-M-27355-2017
VIKAS GARG AND OTHERS VS STATE OF PUNJAB AND
ANOTHER

Present:- None.

Vide order dated 22.05.2018, FIR No.260 dated 21.09.2014, registered under Sections 325, 323, 341, 506, 148, 149, 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (in short 'IPC') and 25 and 27 of the Arms Act and FIR No.283 dated 15.10.2014 registered under Sections 326, 427, 506, 120-B read with Section 34 IPC at Police Station City Barnala, District Barnala, were quashed by this Court in view of the fact that the petitioners (in CRM-M No.27355 of 2017) namely Vikas Garg, Lakhvir Singh @ Lakhi, Harjinder Singh @ Jinder and the petitioners (in CRM-M No.9084 of 2017) namely Hemraj Garg, Bhinder Singh @ Bhinda and Vicky Kumar @ Moma, had compromised the matter with each other and also in view of the report submitted by the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Barnala dated 28.09.2018. In the report, it was stated that one of the accused namely Gurwinder Singh was never arrested and no accused has been declared as proclaimed offender.

The Registry has put up this case again on the basis of the report submitted by the Chief Judicial Magistrate, Barnala dated 28.09.2018 that on 18.01.2018, the aforesaid Gurwinder Singh was declared as proclaimed offender and proceedings qua him are pending before the Court.

Accordingly, this reference is disposed of and it is directed that FIR No.260 dated 21.09.2014 and FIR No.283 dated 15.10.2014,

qua the petitioners (in CRM-M No.27355 of 2017) namely Vikas Garg, Lakhvir Singh @ Lakhi, Harjinder Singh @ Jinder and the petitioners (in CRM-M No.9084 of 2017) namely Hemraj Garg, Bhinder Singh @ Bhinda and Vicky Kumar @ Moma, stands quashed. However, it will be open for the trial Court to proceed further against accused – Gurwinder Singh, who was not arrayed as one of the petitioner in both the petitions.
