1. By this petition, the petitioner seeks quashing of FIR No.423 /2015 under Sections 498A/406/34 IPC, Police Station Pul-prahladpur.

2. The subject FIR emanates out of matrimonial discord. Petitioner No.1 was the husband of respondent No.2. Petitioner Nos.2 & 3 are the parents of petitioner No.1 and petitioner No.4 is the

brother of petitioner No.1.

3. It is contended that parties have settled their disputes amicably and are residing together as husband and wife.

4. Respondent No.2 is present in Court in person, is represented by counsel and identified by the Investigating Officer. She confirms that the settlement has taken place and she does not wish to press any charges

5. In view of the above and keeping in view of the fact that the FIR emanates from matrimonial discord and the parties have resolved their dispute amicably and are living together and further respondent No. 2 does not wish to press her complaint, continuation of criminal proceedings will be an exercise in futility and justice in the case demands that the dispute between the parties is put to an end and peace is restored; securing the ends of justice being the ultimate guiding factor. It would be expedient to quash the subject FIR and the consequent proceedings emanating therefrom.

6. Accordingly, FIR No.423/2015 under Sections 498A/406/34 IPC, Police Station Pul-prahladpur and the consequent proceedings emanating therefrom are hereby quashed.
