Notice. Learned APP accepts notice for respondent no.1. Respondent no.2 is also present along with her counsel, who accepts notice. Respondent no.2 has been identified by SI Prem Kumar of police station Sangam Vihar.

Respondent no.2 submits that matter has been settled between her and petitioner no.1 of her own free will and without any undue force, pressure or coercion before the Counselling Cell, Family Court, Saket Court, New Delhi on 29th August, 2017. Her marriage with the petitioner no.1 has already been dissolved by a decree of divorce by mutual consent dated 28th February, 2018 passed by the Family Court, South District, Saket Court,

New Delhi. Petitioner no.1 has paid ₹3.5 lacs to the respondent no.2 today in Court vide a demand draft, photocopy whereof has been placed on record. Respondent no.2 submits that entire settled amount of ₹7 lacs stands paid with this payment and she has no objection in case FIR No. 301/2014 under Sections 498A/406/34 IPC registered at police station Sangam Vihar is quashed against the petitioner no.1 and his relatives, that is, petitioner nos. 2 to 5.

Keeping in mind the settlement arrived at between the petitioner no.1 and respondent no.2 voluntarily, in my view, no fruitful purpose would be served in keeping the present FIR pending. Accordingly, aforesaid FIR and the consequent proceedings emanating therefrom are quashed.

Petition is disposed of in the above terms. Miscellaneous application is disposed of as infructuous.
