2. Ms. Monika Arora appears on advance notice for respondent No.1 & 2.
3. It is to be noted that the facts obtaining in the present case are identical to the facts obtaining in W.P.(C) No.4655/2018. Counsel for both the parties say that this writ petition can be disposed of, broadly, based on the directions passed in the aforementioned matter.

4. Accordingly, the captioned writ petition is disposed of with the following directions:

- (i) The petitioner is given liberty to approach the Tribunal within two weeks from today.
- (ii) Pending adjudication by the Tribunal, the operation of the impugned communication dated 25.4.2018 shall remain stayed.
