Learned counsel for petitioner submits that petitioner has been granted admission in Hindu College for B.A. (Hons.) in Sanskrit on 8th August, 2018.

The Hindu College is not a respondent in this petition.

For the relief sought in this petition, petitioner has to make a Representation to Hindu College to seek change of subject, in light of the preferences indicated as above.

Learned counsel for petitioner submits that in this regard, a Representation to Hindu College would be made within a week from today. If such a Representation is received by Hindu College, then it be considered within a period of four weeks in the light of afore-referred preferences indicated by petitioner.
