**ORDER**

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By this petition the petitioner seeks parole on the ground that he has to re-establish social ties. As per the Status Report filed, besides the present FIR being FIR No.177/1991 under Section 302 IPC registered at PS Jahangirpuri wherein the petitioner has been convicted and undergoing sentence the petitioner was involved in other FIR being FIR No.571/1996 under Sections 302/34 IPC registered at PS Jahangirpuri and also FIR No.573/1996 under Section 5 of Explosive Act and sections 121/121A/122/123/120B/34 IPC registered at PS Jahangirpuri.

Though the petitioner has been acquitted in FIR No.571/1996 he was convicted in FIR No.573/1996 and has undergone the sentence awarded. In the present case the petitioner was granted parole by the Government w.e.f. 21<sup>st</sup> March, 2009 to 4<sup>th</sup> April, 2009 when the petitioner jumped the parole and could be re-arrested only on 21<sup>st</sup> April, 2010.

Considering the Nominal Roll and the earlier conduct of the petitioner, this Court finds no ground to grant parole to the petitioner.

Petition is dismissed.
