Respondent no. 2 Ms. Sarika is present in Court and has been identified by ASI Devender Kumar of police station Uttam Nagar. Respondent no. 2 submits that she has settled the matter with the petitioner no. 1 of her own free will and without any undue force, pressure or coercion. Respondent no. 2 says that her marriage with petitioner no. 1 has already been dissolved by a decree of divorce by mutual consent on 7th December, 2016 passed by the Family Courts, North District, Rohini Courts, Delhi. Respondent no. 2 submits that she has already received ₹6,50,000/- out of the total settled amount. Petitioner no. 1 has handed over a post-dated cheque no. 780521 dated 10th February, 2018 for ₹50,000/- drawn on Punjab National Bank,

Prashant Vihar, Delhi, favouring respondent no. 2. Respondent no. 2 submits that she has no objection in case FIR is quashed against the petitioner no.1 and his relatives, that is, petitioner nos. 2 to 4, subject to realization of the cheque.

Keeping in view the settlement arrived at between the parties and that marriage between the petitioner no. 1 and respondent no. 2 has already been dissolved, no fruitful purpose would be served to keep the criminal proceedings pending. Accordingly, in the interest of justice, FIR No.211/2013 under Sections 498-A/406/34 IPC registered at Police Station Uttam Nagar and the consequent proceedings emanating therefrom are quashed, subject to realization of the aforesaid cheque.

Petition is disposed of in the above terms. Dasti.
