ORAL ORDER

4 19-07-2019 This is an application for grant of anticipatory bail in connection with Ghoghardiha P.S. Case No. 31 of 2018, disclosing offences under Sections 498A, 341, 323, 504, 506, 494, 34 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 3/4 of Dowry Prohibition Act.

Prosecution story as per F.I.R. is that petitioner, who happens to be the husband of the informant demanded Rs.3,00,000/- and for that assaulted her and lastly she has been ousted from the house by snatching her son also. It is also alleged that he has re-married with another lady.

Submission of learned counsel for the petitioner is that the whole allegation is false and concocted and he is still



ready to keep her with dignity and care.

Heard learned APP as well as learned counsel for the opposite party no.2 also, they have also no objection in residing with the petitioner, if she is allowed to live with dignity and care and he will provide proper food and other articles as per her desire.

In such view of the matter, let the petitioner, above named, surrender before the learned court below on 31.07.2019 and on that day the opposite party no.2 shall also remain present in the Court, and further on filing of an affidavit by the petitioner that he is ready to keep her with dignity and care and to take her from the Court itself, then he will be released on provisional bail for a period of six months. During that period, the learned court below shall watch the conduct of both the parties and further directs that both the parties shall appear in the second week of each month before the learned court below. Once the court below is satisfied with the conduct of both the parties, and their marital relationship, especially the conduct of the petitioner, the court below either confirm the bail bonds of the petitioner or pass any other orders, which may deem fit and proper, including cancelling the bail bonds of the petitioner.

With the aforesaid observations, this application is



disposed of.
