ORAL ORDER

2 09-04-2019 Heard learned counsel for the petitioners and learned APP
for the State.

2. The petitioners apprehend their arrest for the offences alleged under Sections 307 and 504/34 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 27 of the Arms Act registered in connection with Mansi P.S. Case No. 251 of 2018.

3. It is submitted that the petitioners have been falsely implicated in the backdrop of longstanding family dispute. The petitioners are own brothers and the informant is the cousin *Bhabhi* of the petitioners. There is also political rivalry between the parties and most of the criminal antecedents of the petitioners relate to such cases. It is submitted that the accusation of firing upon the informant is not corroborated by any injury report showing any injury caused to anyone.

4. Learned APP assisted by learned counsel for the informant opposes the anticipatory bail petition.

5. Be that as it may, in the event of the petitioners' arrest



or surrender before the court below within six weeks from the date of communication of this order, let the above named petitioners be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/- (ten thousand) each with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Khagaria in connection with Mansi P.S. Case No. 251 of 2018, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438 (2) of the Cr.P.C. and with further conditions --

(i) That one of the bailors of each of the petitioners shall be their close relatives.

(ii) That the petitioners shall not indulge in any similar offence till conclusion of the trial.

(iii) That the petitioners shall remain physically present in court on each and every date during trial and in the event of failure on two consecutive dates without sufficient reason, their bail bonds shall be liable to be cancelled by the learned Court concerned.

(iv) That the petitioners shall cooperate with the investigation, if not already concluded, and make themselves available as and when so required and in case of failure, the State shall be at liberty to move for cancellation of bail.
