Heard learned counsel for the petitioner; learned AC to AAG 5 for the State and Mr. Anjani Kumar, learned senior counsel along with Mr. Shailendra Kumar, learned counsel for the Bihar State Food and Civil Supplies Corporation Limited (hereinafter referred to as the 'Corporation').
