for the State.

2. The petitioners apprehend arrest for the offences alleged under Sections 147, 149, 341, 323, 354 and 379 of the Indian Penal Code registered in connection with Paraiya P.S. Case No. 207 of 2018.

3. It is submitted that the petitioners have been falsely implicated in the backdrop of the dispute as both the parties are Gotias. The specific accusation under non-bailable sections of the IPC is against other accused persons namely Praveen Yadav and Sanjay Yadav. The accusation of assault by the petitioners with fists and slaps attributable to the petitioners is general and omnibus in nature. The petitioners claim clean antecedents.

4. Be that as it may, in the event of the petitioners' arrest or surrender before the court below within six weeks from the date of communication of this order, let the above named petitioners be



released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/- (ten thousand) each with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Gaya in connection with Paraiya P.S. Case No. 207 of 2018, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438 (2) of the Cr.P.C. and with further conditions --

(i) That one of the bailors of each of the petitioners shall be their close relatives.

(ii) That the petitioners shall not indulge in any similar offence till conclusion of the trial.

(iii) That the petitioners shall remain physically present in court on each and every date during trial and in the event of failure on two consecutive dates without sufficient reason, their bail bonds shall be liable to be cancelled by the learned Court concerned.

(iv) That the petitioners shall cooperate with the investigation, if not already concluded, and make themselves available as and when so required and in case of failure, the State shall be at liberty to move for cancellation of bail.
