3 07-01-2019 It is submitted by the learned counsel for the petitioner that though the writ petition has been filed for quashing of the first information report of Piro P.S. Case No.292 of 2016 registered under Sections 409, 420, 120B read with 34 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 7 of the Essential Commodities Act, during pendency of the writ petition, the police have already submitted final report. He submitted that in view of the subsequent development, the writ petition may be disposed of with liberty to the petitioner that in case an adverse



order is passed by the Magistrate on perusal of the police report submitted under Section 173(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, the petitioner may challenge the same in accordance with law.
