2 27-09-2019 Heard Sri D.V. Pathy, learned counsel for the petitioner and Sri Vikash Kumar, learned Standing Counsel no.11.

The petitioner, invoking writ jurisdiction of this Court under Article-226 of the Constitution of India, has sought following reliefs:

(i) the respondent no.1 be directed to constitute a full bench of the Commercial Taxes Tribunal, Bihar, Patna

(ii) the Commercial Taxes Tribunal, Bihar, Patna be directed to hear and dispose of the petition for restoration of



appeal and also the appeal on its merit.

(iii)the notice dated 29.06.2019 (as contained in Annexure-8) by the respondent no.3 directing payment of a sum of Rs.16,98,517/- on account of disputed demand of tax raised in pursuance of an order of assessment be stayed.

However, at the time of hearing, learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that restoration petition has already been allowed by the Commercial Taxes Tribunal and, as such, the main relief, which was sought for in the present writ petition, has already been granted. He further tried to persuade the Court to pass order in respect of the relief, as sought for in paragraph-1(iii).

Sri Vikash Kumar, learned Standing Counsel no.11 submits that the coram is over by constituting of two members only, which has allowed the restoration petition.

Considering the fact that the relief, which was mainly sought for in the present writ petition, has already been allowed, there is no reason to pass further order.

The writ petition stands disposed of.
