2 02-08-2019 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned counsel appearing on behalf of the State.

The grievance of the petitioner in the present writ petition is non-disposal of his representation filed on 31.5.2019.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has approached the District Education Officer, Gaya by way of filing representation dated 31.5.2019 yet his case has
