At the outset, it has been pointed out by Mr. Ramakant Sharma, Senior Advocate for the petitioner that though the writ petition has been filed for quashing the FIR, the investigation has already been completed and the police have submitted report under Section 173(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure whereby the petitioner has not been sent up for trial, but differing with the police report the court below has taken cognizance of the offence.
