2. The petitioners apprehend their arrest for the offences alleged under Sections 341, 323, 379, 354, 504/34 of the Indian Penal Code registered in connection with Gardanibagh Case No. 225 of 2018.

3. It is submitted that the petitioners have been falsely implicated as a result of petty dispute as the petitioners as well as the informant are all the tenants in the same building. The allegation of misbehaviour against petitioner no. 3 Vikash Kumar is vague in nature while the accusation against petitioner no. 1 Guriya Devi of snatching the mobile phone and jewelry (*Mangal Sutra*) of the informant is ornamental. The petitioners claim clean antecedents.

4. Having regard to the entirety of the facts and circumstances of the case, in the event of the petitioners' arrest or surrender before the court below within six weeks from the date of communication of this order, let the above named petitioners be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/- (ten



thousand) each with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Patna, in connection with Gardanibagh Case No. 225 of 2018, subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C. and with further conditions –

(i) That one of the bailors of each of the petitioners shall be their close relatives.

(ii) That the petitioners shall not indulge in any similar offence till conclusion of the trial.

(iii) That the petitioners shall remain physically present in court on each and every date during trial and in the event of failure on two consecutive dates without sufficient reason, their bail bonds shall be liable to be cancelled by the learned Court concerned.

(iv) That the petitioners shall cooperate with the investigation, if not already concluded, and make themselves available as and when so required and in case of failure, the State shall be at liberty to move for cancellation of bail.
