2 17-12-2019 Heard learned counsel for the petitioner and learned
APP for the State.

The petitioner seeks bail in a case registered under
Sections 302/34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Allegation is that the petitioner and co-accused
Madan Manjhi had caught hold of informant's son and co-
accused Ranjeet Manjhi had stabbed her son by means of knife,
due to which he fell down and then he was taken to the Hospital
where the doctor declared him dead.

It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioner that
the petitioner is in custody since 26.08.2019 and has got no
criminal antecedent. Charge sheet has been submitted in this
case. There is no allegation of tampering of witnesses alleged
against the petitioner. The petitioner is alleged to have caught



hold of the deceased at the time of occurrence. There is no allegation of injury attributed against the petitioner. The main allegation is against the co-accused Ranjeet Manjhi, who is said to have given stab blow upon the deceased. Other co-accused has been granted bail vide Annexure 2 to the present application.

On behalf of the State, it is submitted that the petitioner is named in the F.I.R.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances, let the petitioner, above named, be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of Rs.10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned Chief Judicial Magistrate, Saran at Chapra in connection with Chapra Town P.S. case No.469 of 2018.
