1. We have heard Mr. Gunale, learned counsel for the petitioners and Mr. Dhongade, learned counsel for respondent no. 1, Mr. Sharma, learned counsel for respondent no. 2, Mr. Yawalkar, learned Addl.G.P. for respondent no. 3, Mr. Aditya, learned counsel for respondent no. 4.
